Luiz Mazzon, Director Asia, Humane Farm Animal Care; President, Instituto Certified Humane, Brazil
Mr Mazzon was born in Southern Brazil and is graduated in Law and Business. In addition to practical research on feedstuff quality and dietary supplement evaluation in poultry diets, his work focuses on nutrition-immune function interactions and bone biology in meat and egg-type poultry.
